To be read by all participants as well as their parents/guardians/carers/responsible adults

ZOOM account and name

The Zoom account owner must be over 18

We recommend that you do not use the full name and surname of the minor (you can use a name only, or {Name} [Initial], for example.

Participants aged under 18 need to be supervised by a parent/carer/responsible adult for all the duration of each session.

By participating in the Scottish Mathematics Masterclasses, participants agree to:

- Maintain a positive and supportive learning environment
- Treat instructors and other participants with politeness and respect
- Only discuss topics relating Maths, or the topics covered in the Mathematics Masterclasses
- Be supportive when discussing other people's ideas. If criticising, make sure it is respectful and constructive criticism
- Dress appropriately and ensure anyone else in the video or who could be in the video is also dressed appropriately
- If using video, attend from an appropriate location, such as a shared family room, or else use a virtual background.
- To protect your privacy, we recommend that you use a virtual background if you use video at all.

By participating in the Scottish Mathematics Masterclasses, participants agree **not to:**

- Record, screenshot, photograph or video any segments of the sessions
- Share anything that someone else has shared without their permission.
- Share their personal details including, but not limited to, account details, phone numbers, email address, postal address, their school
- Attend from a bedroom if using video. If this is the only available location, use a virtual background, or only use audio and not video
- Use an inappropriate name when registering for the session
- Pretend to be another person or set up accounts in another person's name
- Use offensive, abusive or elitist language or swear words in either audio or written communications.
- Argue with other participants in the session. If disagreements arise, discuss each other's ideas in a respectful and constructive manner
- Contact others individually via the chat
- Contact other participants privately during or after the session
- Post or upload anything offensive or abusive or unrelated to the topic being discussed
- Post any promotional material or spam messages to the chat or group
